PRESIDENT'S NOTES by Linda Wright

January 14th meeting:

The administration has acknowledged the staff and faculty concern about air quality in building, and has communicated its intention to conduct a building-by-building evaluation.

Staff Congress discussed and approved the NKU policy regarding Americans with disabilities.

The policy committee continues work with administration on changes to the temporary disability leave policy. You may recall that this policy was taken to the Board of Regents without Staff Congress endorsement. We are now working on changes to make it acceptable to all parties.

February 11th meeting:

Shirley Raleigh has agreed to represent staff on the selection committee for the prestigious Lincoln Award.

Everyone should be aware that the titling committee has distributed Personnel Services' draft of proposed titling and career pathing. This is only a draft, so it is very important that your comments and questions be forwarded to the committee in writing. Constructive ideas are solicited. The executive committee met with the second shift staff on Friday, February 19 at 4:30 in Nunn Hall 419 to air any concerns that they might have and give an update on Staff Congress activities.

The smoking policy committee has been reviewing state guidelines, input from individuals on campus, and research from other institutions. We have been notified that three phases will be instituted. The first phase began the week of February 22. By the time you receive this newsletter, more information should be available regarding the policy. The committee is still investigating the designation of smoking areas, air cleaning, etc. The committee initially mentioned holding open forum sessions for input. We are hoping that these will occur. The budget committee is attending a joint meeting with the budget office and the Faculty Senate budget committee to discuss the preliminary base budget for fiscal year 1993-94.
