Tidbits from Congress:

• Staff Congress will meet on West campus sometime in the fall.

- The Survey Data has been entered and the results should be available soon. Martha Malloy thanked Linda, Debbie, and Audrey for typing comments from Staff Survey. Martha Malloy and Mike Baker will read the comments.
- Martha was thanked for her years as Staff Regent. Mike Baker thanked her for an outstanding job.
- Martha thanked the staff for all of their support while being Staff Regent.
- The Board of Regents met on 5/10. The Budget was approved for next year. The Appointment of Rogers Redding was approved. The Tuition waiver was approved; 6 credit hours per semester for spouse and dependents. If you have more than one child attending NKU they each get 6 credit hours. This is for undergraduate credits only. The employee still retains their 6 credit hours also. Martha has formed a committee to work on the procedural issue (paper work, etc).
- Effective July 1st, a person who has been employed at NKU for 9 years or more can elect to convert up to 5 vacation days a year to sick time. This would count towards their retirement.
- The Market Pay Committee met 2 weeks ago. \$410,000 was recommended, which represents 3% of the total staff salaries. Every pay grade to be positively impacted. Pay Grades 10-18 will receive a \$500 per position increase or 90% of market target which ever is higher. Part-time positions are adjusted on a pro-rated basis. If you are already at 90% or above due to longevity or previous merit you will still receive a \$500 adjustment. Pay Grades 19-26 will be adjusted to 84% of market target or a fixed \$1,000.00 increase, whichever is greater. During the past phases, many of the positions in Information Technology were adjusted to 100%, so these positions will not receive a market adjustment. The goal is for the last phase to be implemented and completed over the next 2 years. Staff will receive notification of merit/market raise on Friday, June 2nd. They hope to include a list of the pay grades and the market target for each grade. This will allow people to see where they should be after market adjustments are completed. Possibly this list may be sent out as part of the Campus Digest.
- Staff Congress election is completed and all areas are filled. Covington Campus will be represented.
- Staff Regent election was a re-run due to a tie and the inability to have a 50%+1 win. They have

had more ballots returned the 2nd time around. Results pending.

- Reminder that we now have to pay to use the parking garage. See Linda Parks to get an updated card for parking purposes.
- Reminder to those of you who received vouchers for service to use them by June 30th. You can now receive change after using them in the cafeteria.
- Reminder to attend the Faculty/Staff Fitness Day (one mile walk) on Tuesday, May 16th at 12 noon.
