Green, afsignee [assignee] ------</u> a Tract of Land containing <u>Six Hundred + Forty (640) ------</u> acres, lying in being in the County of <u>Cherokee -----</u>, Section No. 6275, in District <u>No. 6 -----</u>, warrant No. <u>6275.</u>, it is being part of the land lately acquired by Treaty from the Cherokee Indians, and sold in obedience to an act of the General Assembly of this State, bounded as follows, viz: [inserted space for comments on survey]

Beginning on a Black Oak, the N.W. corner of No. 6273 and running thence North crossing a branch with cherry + holly timber at 200 poles, 320 poles to a hickory on a rich mountain side; thence West 320 poles too large poplar; thence South 320 poles too large chestnut corner of No, thence East 320 [text missing]
