

#### SACS ACCREDITATION....

The year 1986-87 will be remembered by many at NKU as the year that the institution became "over-SACSed". During the past 16 months, more than 125 faculty and staff have served on one of the six major committees in producing drafts that will ultimately culminate in a self-study report for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). SACS is the regional accrediting body that determines if NKU has set appropriate objectives through its mission statement, that the University has the resources to meet these objectives reasonable well, and that the institution can be expected to continue to do so.

To make such an assessment, the institution must produce a self-study report that summarizes and evaluates virtually every facet of the institution, ranging from its educational programs to its physical plant to its accounting procedures. Many of you have contributed significantly to this process in your role as resource offices by providing the information upon which committees are basing their reports. You also may have participated in the process by responding to the staff survey last month. Approximately 350 responses (58%) were returned and tabulated for inclusion in the study, and you should know that the Steering Committee greatly appreciated your support in these efforts.

Currently the committees are drafting sections of the report and developing recommendations for how NKU can improve its educational delivery system. By mid-September, the Steering Committee will have the report ready for institution-wide review and comment, then make the final revisions before printing. In March, 1988, a committee of educations from throughout the South will visit the campus and report their findings to SACS. Finally, In December, 1988, a decision on reaffirmation of NKU's accreditation will be made.
