Shelbyville Ky [Shelbysville, Kentucky] Aprile 8th 1857 [April 8, 1857] Mr H. Bruce [Henry Bruce]

Dears Sir

I have just returned from Chicago and now will fulfil [fulfill] my promise; to let you hear from me when I returned in relation to the rise of property in that City, and the prospects for the future. Property has advanced rapidly since I was there last summer, and the prospects seem as good as ever for a still rapid advance for some time to come, The lot that we purchased in February/56 [February 1856] for \$278." per front foot can now be sold for \$425" per foot, and prospects for an advance seemes [seems] as good now if not better than when we purchased, I found a lot on Clark and Adams corner St front 100 feet on Clark by 90 on Adams for \$800." per front foot-- time ten years 6 per cent [percent] per annum payable semiannually in advance-- There is a dwelling on the lot that can be sold for \$1000 cash and taken off-- with \$15,000." to improve this lot there can be 5 houses built of brick 20 by 70 feet three stories that can be rented on an average of \$12,000." per annum payable monthly in advance-- and out of those rents \$6000 per annum will pay the interest taxes commissions and insurance and all expences [expenses] -- in this \$6000 per annum can be saved and put at interest at 12 per cent [percent] per annum for 10 years will pay for the lot and improvements and beyond a doubt at the expiration of ten years this lot will sell for \$125,000 if not more-- this is the opinion of good judges living in the City-- there is another lot of 20 Acres ajoining [adjoining] the 20 acres that Mr Ranson of your City sold twelve months since-- this 20 acres

can be bought for \$32,000." one half Cash balance 3 and 6 months without interest— or one half of the lot Choice \$17 000.00 same terms— the owner will insure 20 per cent [percent] advance per annum for three years and take the property back if the purchaser desires it at that time or he may keep it— this lot is south adjoining the City limits and this part of the City will improve rapidly from the fact that the City are to make a park of not less than 100 acres nor more than 300 acres— and will make a canal from the river to the Lake some where near this lot of ground— If you wish to purchase and like either of these lots and do not wish to have the trouble of attending to them— if you can furnish the means I will take an interest in either and pay you a fair per cent [percent] on my interest in the investment and manage it by your advice and instructions the 20 acres I think preferable to the other from the fact that there is lefs [less] complication and trouble about it— this lot is all laid out in 200 lots 25 by 125 feet or near that— please let me hear from you very soon
