Tidbits from Congress:

- Vice President Baker commented on the recent I-Team report about safety concerns on campus. An audit of Public Safety, conducted by the Southern Police Institute, is still ongoing; findings will be available to the public. The campus has an excellent safety record; crime has never intentionally been Also, the Council on misreported. Postsecondary Education is currently helping each Kentucky institution understand how to report crime according to the Minger Act 2000. Future training sessions regarding recognizing and reporting a crime will be available for faculty and staff. The library staff is already participating in crime training sessions.
- The three vacancies on Staff Congress were filled. Voted in were Shirley Welitzkin, Alumni Affairs, Glenn Strausbaugh, Health, Counseling & Testing, and Ron Vasko, Physical Plant. Welcome Shirley, Glenn & Ron!
- Staff Congress discussed at length the conversion of information across campus from paper copy to an electronic format. Many people like the electronic format (like Midweek), but they prefer other information stay in hard copy format. A major concern is that employees on campus who do not have access to a computer are not as informed as those who do. How do you feel about this issue? Should the Campus Digest return to paper format? Please contact a Staff Congress representative and let them know what your preference would be.
- ❖ Information was requested regarding the increase in salary received by Dr. Votruba. Martha Malloy explained that Dr. Votruba is required to set goals early in the year and then is evaluated based on his accomplishments as they relate to his goals. The Board of Regents Chairman then recommends a salary increase based on the evaluation. The Board felt that the President had a great year on campus and in Frankfort. It was noted that Dr. Votruba's increase does not come from the 6% staff salary pool.
- The Benefits Committee will be looking into "cafeteria" health plans and pre-tax savings plans for future consideration. Human Resources is also looking into these issues and has hired a consultant to assist them.
