## Beta Beta's Butterfly Garden seeks plants, volunteer gardeners

Did you know the state insect of Kentucky is the viceroy butterfly?

An intriguing project being launched by Beta Beta Beta (BBB) will attempt to lure this small celebrity as well as other visitors,

winged and otherwise, to the NKU campus. At the hub of this activity is the new Beta Beta Butterfly Garden, located on the plaza between the Natural Science Center and Nunn Hall.

BBB, the biology honor society for students, planned the Butterfly Garden as a means not only to preserve habitat that is being lost through development and the use of pesticides, but to enable BBB to become more involved in the campus community, to make a permanent contribution to NKU, and to provide an area of natural beauty that can be enjoyed by students, faculty, staff, and visitors.

After a year and a half of hard work, which included the removal of 30 Japanese yews plus 1080 square feet of ground cover and weeds from the garden area, the time to plant has finally arrived.

Now BBB is asking the NKU community to help with the enjoyable part of preparing the garden. BBB is looking for donation of plants and also welcomes gardeners who can help the group plant these specimens.

The planting of the Butterfly Garden is scheduled for Saturday, September 6 (with Saturday, September 13 as a rain date).

The donations can be purchased plants or plants dug from gardens at home. Empty pots will be available in the BBB lounge

on the fifth floor of the natural Science Center for those who would like to donate plants from their own gardens; gardeners may stop by after Monday, August 25 and take what they need.

BBB will accept plant donations for the garden on Friday, September 5; plants can be dropped off at the Natural Science loading dock on Friday, September 5 between 7:30 and 9:30 a.m. and 1 and 3 p.m.

Individuals who would like to drop off plants earlier may bring them to Natural Science Center 130 or the BBB lounge between Monday, August 25 and Wednes-

day, September 3.
