Minutes: Leland Bennett made a motion to accept the minutes as written, seconded by Gina Bray. Motion carried.

President Jeff Chesnut welcomed new member Paul Frazier. He also announced that Lois Fox has resigned from Staff Congress and will be replaced by Jim McCulley.

- Laurie DiPadova-Stocks of Scripps Howard Center for Civic Engagement and Katie Herschede of NKU's office of Community & Government Relations
- President Votruba has designated November 4, 2003 as Democracy Day Get Out & Vote. Stressed importance of strong voter turnout in Northern Kentucky so Frankfort will know that we need support in this area. Passed out flyers regarding voter registration. Also reiterated importance of contacting legislators via e-mail, phone or other means for every issue including health insurance, education, etc.

Staff Regent: Bev Beck

 Met August 26. After an intense and lengthy investigation of misconduct in the College of Business Department of Finance, 3 faculty members resigned and 1 faculty member was dismissed. The Regents will hold a retreat on 9/21 & 9/22. Next meeting will be September 24, 2003.

Liaison: Martha Malloy

- Health insurance renewal staying with Anthem Blue Cross/Blue Shield for another year. Rates for NKU employees will increase 7.5% (the national average is 15%). Increases are based upon claims experience so Martha thanked NKU employees for having such a "healthy" year. Will continue the free single HMO B plan at this point, committee explored several different options regarding this coverage and decided to keep it free for one more year. Will explore again next year. No benefit changes in HMO B, slight change in HMO A (drug co-pay was raised). Thanked the Health Utilization committee for all their hard work & dedication in this process. Will offer an optional short-term disability policy at employee's cost, no NKU cost involved. Open enrollment will be held in October.
- Denim Day for Breast Cancer research on Friday, October 10, 2003. For a \$5.00 or more donation you can wear denim to work that day.
- Staff Appreciation Day on October 23, 2003. Royleen Seibert will chair the Regent's Distinguished Service Award Committee.
 Contract employees' years of service will now count as NKU years of service. Service years are based on continuous years of service with no break in service.

Student Government Association Representative: Eric Fegan – absent. Attended round table discussions for a short period of time but had to leave due to prior commitment.

<u>Vice President for Administration & Finance: Ken Ramey</u> – absent. Attended round table discussions for a short period of time but had to leave due to prior commitment.
