1992-1993 Senate Representation

This means that Professional Studies picks up an additional "at-large" due to their growth in faculty. Business remains at four, but one is now an at-large. If no one is nominated for the seat, I propose that the current two Senators remain from the newly created single department remain, as they will both have a second year remaining on their departmental "term".
