Behavioral Sciences: anthropology, economics, psychology, and sociology

Humanities: journalism, literature, modern languages, and philosophy

Mathematics:

Physical Science: astronomy, chemistry, geology, and physics

Social Science: geography, history, and political science

A student would be required to take six hours in six of the seven general education areas. In addition, he must complete six credit hours in English composition or the equivalent thereof.
