Dennis Taulbee spoke on University budget concerns at the September 11 Staff Congress meeting. We would like to thank Dennis for taking the time to meet with Staff Congress, and for his honest and forthright discussion of the University budget.

A major point that he made concerns the salary increase for 1985-86. The State Legislature issued the following:

Article III. BUDGET INTENT STATEMENTS:

The General Assembly budget directs that funds for the total annual increment allowance for university personnel shall be limited to not more than 2% in Fiscal Year 1984-85 and not more than 3% in 1985-86.
