Synopsis of September 13 Staff Congress Meeting:

Dennis Taulbee made a presentation regarding the proposed annexation of a portion of NKU to the city of Highland Heights.

The recent change by Personnel Service in the managerial/supervisory classification was done as a computer change to correct a misapplied Equal Employment Opportunity code number. No changes in pay or benefits will occur, and affected employees will be notified by memo.

Pending approval by Dr. Boothe, Personnel Services is working on a bid for hiring an outside consultant to implement NKU's classification system. This is the result of a recommendation in the Fortunato report, and should not affect the amount of money available for reclassification.

Emergency Evacuation: Signs are being prepared to explain new sirens installed on campus. A question was raised as to whether the sirens are linked to a city or county system.
