- Royleen Seibert and Beverly Beck will serve on the Market Adjustment Committee.
- Sites for the Suggestion Boxes have been selected and will appear on campus soon.
- Staff Congress meeting time will remain at one o'clock.
- Due to the workload involved with the Benefits Committee and the Salary & Budget Committee, they will remain as separate committees.
- The answer to the question of whether employees accrue vacation time when working overtime is as
 follows. You accrue up to and including the first 40 hours of the week only. Any overtime beyond
 40 hours does not accrue vacation time.
- It was noted that even though we have had severe weather this winter, fewer accidents have been
 reported than last year. Whenever a severe weather warning is issued by the Weather Bureau it is the
 individual's responsibility to decide whether it is safe for them to drive in to work or not. This is
 when our Personal Days come in handy.
