The following resolution was brought to the Senate by the Professional Concerns Committee...

Because of the grave concerns raised in the Athletic Council's Report on the Football Initiative, Faculty Senate urges in the strongest possible terms that the Board of Regents not vote on the Football Initiative until the questions and issues contained in the Athletic Council's Report are answered, addressed, and discussed by the NKU community.

Discussion: So it is not a Football initiative; it's an athletic Enhancement proposal. So Interim President Moreland has formed a committee to look into the financial aspect. [Question: Aren't the horses already out of the barn? Is this sincere (other than sincerely empty and late)?] and how are we to consider the statement that football--not yet established as a viable program should be allowed to compete for funding at the same level as any other program? How can student gov't. vote on an issue about which they do not have full information? <u>Carla Chance</u>: The predicted outcome of the football initiative is:

1. In '98/'99 there is a predicted shortfall of \$136 K and

2. In '99/2000 with so called facilities "on line' the shortfall will be \$200K without other athletic facilities meeting NAAC standards.

SUBJECT: Agenda Items Passed by the Faculty Senate

Thank you for forwarding copies of items passed by the Faculty Senate, together with recommended actions. I will address them in the order of your memorandum and forward them to President Moreland as appropriate

(1) The Planning Commission will receive the budget priorities recommendations as part of the materials provided to its members prior to the January retreat.

(2) I will ask John Alberti and Fran Zaniello to assume responsibility for oversight and implementation of the pilot project regarding mid-semester grades and the early alert program for freshman. They will work closely with the Faculty Senate and with Student Affairs to make certain that the requirements of the pilot project are met. As you know, I intend to seek approval through the budget process of a new but long needed position, Director of Special Programs and Freshman Initiatives. This director would in time assume responsibility for this intervention. I appreciate the good work on this proposal by Rudy Garns, and others.

(3) My colleagues on the Deans' Council and I thank the Faculty Senate for its unanimous endorsement of the Deans' Council White Paper, "The Budget Process at Northern Kentucky University." Having raised for discussion and general agreement the principle set forth in this White Paper, we must now proceed to develop guidelines for implementation of a process that would meet these requirements. I will consult with you as this process moves forward.

(4) The unanimous approval by the Faculty Senate of the NKU Learning Community pilot project represents another important step forward toward the fulfillment of our mission. John Alberti and Fran Zaniello will maintain oversight with regard to this project during the spring semester. Again, it is our hope that approval of a director's position will make possible the continued development of this very important undertaking.

(5) Together with the other materials you have forwarded to me, I will convey to President Moreland for transmission to the Board of Regents the resolution you report.
