## **Tidbits from Congress:**

Beth Warren will return to campus to work with Personnel to refine the Merit Pay Policy.

Phase I for bringing salaries to market will include @ 30% of the staff and affect 12 pay grade levels. The proposal is looking at an October implementation date, and should be retroactive back to July 1, 1998.

Health care bids were sent out and seven companies have responded. A contract for one carrier should be awarded by mid October.

The Emergency Sick Bank will soon be a reality. Sick and/or vacation time may be donated with a maximum of ten days. Participation is voluntary and the program will be evaluated after two years. In order to qualify for withdrawal you will need to be in a NO PAY status for ten days. You may then apply to the Benevolent Association and if accepted receive thirty days of sick pay. You may apply one additional time for a total of sixty days. Complete information will be sent out soon.

Supervisory training will take place in late October / early November. It will be a shared effort by the Consortium f Colleges and Universities.




Hindu Proverb
