You **MUST** make new application if:

1. You are changing from one company to another.
2. You are staying with Blue Cross/Blue Shield.
3. You are staying with Choice Care.
4. You now have a single plan and wish a family plan.
5. You now have a single or family plan and wish a two party plan.
6. You wish to add eligible family members to your plan.

Please read information from Personnel Office dated May 15, 1987. (Notice the change in costs.) Even if you have already turned your new application in to Personnel and you see a better plan for you, you may submit a new application.

ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE IN PERSONNEL, AC 708, BY 4:30 P.M. MAY 29, 1987. COVERAGE BEGINS JULY 1, 1987.
