Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 1:02 PM.

<u>Minutes:</u> The following corrections were made to the minutes of the October 9, 2003 meeting: Maureen Woods was absent, Royleen Seibert was absent, Marilyn Siry was present. Motion to accept the minutes with corrections was made by Leland Bennett, seconded by Gina Bray. Motion carried.

Staff Regent Report: Bev Beck

- Carole Beere, Associate Provost for Outreach & Graduate Studies, gave a presentation regarding programs they sponsor with grants, subsidies, etc.
- Financial Report Presentation by Students to protect quality of education which includes smaller class size, quality
 professors, equipment, etc. majority of students are willing to accept a tuition increase.
- President Votruba has asked all department heads to cut their budgets gearing for a 3%, 5% and/or 7% budget reduction.
- Renovated Nunn Drive entrance looks great.
- Two students gave presentations that showcased research work done at the undergraduate level. In most higher learning institutions this type of in-depth research is done at the graduate level.

Vice President for Administration & Finance: Ken Ramey

Stressed importance of members attending the meeting with President Votruba & vice President Gerald Hunter on October 19 regarding financial report.

NKU was approached by TANK to determine interest in selling their passes & coupons on campus. NKU would not make any profit just provide the service to employees and students.

Student Government Representative: Trey Orndorff - Absent, no report.

Standing Committee Reports:

Benefits: Maureen Woods, Co-Chair.

- Presented proposed following change in Red Book: "Any permanent employee, who has worked at least five years for Northern Kentucky University and is awarded at least three (3) weeks of vacation each year, may convert each any part of up to a maximum of five (5) days of vacation hours to sick hours". President Chesnut asked the committee to amend/revise the proposed change to read: "permanent" to "regular" & "at least five years of employment" to "has worked at least 4 years & entering their fifth year of employment".
- President Chesnut also asked the Benefits Committee to re-examine domestic partner benefits since Faculty Senate passed a new proposal addressing this benefit.
- Constitution & Bylaws: Pat Radank Chair. Working in conjunction with Credentials & Elections committee on proposed changes to make language more explicit. Distributed proposed changes to membership.

Credentials & Elections: Cheryl Edelen - Chair. Working in conjunction with Constitution & Bylaws Committee on proposed changes to make language more explicit. Distributed proposed changes to membership.

Policies: Don Vasko. Have met. Distributed a draft of the Equal Opportunity Policy that Cheryl Nunez, Director of Affirmative Action & Multicultural Affairs, sent to committee for review.

Salary/Budget: Leland Bennett. Have not met but has coordinated with offices of Vice President Ramey and Vice President Hunter. Reiterated importance of meeting on October 19 with President Votruba.
