SYNOPSIS OF SEPTEMBER 10, 1987 MEETING.....

UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN - United Way Coordinator, Mike Baker, announced the kick off date was September 9, 1987 for the 1987 Northern Kentucky Community's Campaign. The campus drive will take place the week of October 12th for this very important and needed support for others in distressful situations. Examples include disaster relief, emergency food, shelter and clothing, services to senior citizens, families, mentally and physically impaired and disabled, victims of crime, disease, poverty and accident, day care for children and elderly, counseling and much more (over 500,000 people benefit). In support of this effort it has been resolved by Staff Congress: "That the Staff Congress of Northern Ky. University urges the staff and community of the university to consider giving their 'Fair Share to United Way and to MAKE A DIFFERENCE of giving, volunteering to help, in the 1987 United Way Fundraising Campaign."......Distinguished Service Awards Luncheon has been set for September 28, 1987 at 12:00 noon in the U.C. Ballroom. See menu elsewhere in this letter.....A standing Food Service Advisory Committee has been appointed. Ron Rieger and Peg Goodrich represent Staff Congress......The Task Force - Health Insurance Benefits Committee is working on a survey to be distributed soon......Changes in Staff Congress Bylaws - Did you know? Staff Congress representatives will be elected in May, not in November. Terms of office begin in July, not in January. All voting takes place through the mail......Between 300 and 350 persons attended the Faculty/Staff picnic on August 22, 1987......Emergency/Evacuation Committee reported on a number of issues to be studied in order to be sure sounding alarms are heeded and procedures instituted as soon as possible for the protection of the NKU Community. They recommended a committee to be appointed to persue this further and the emergency/evacuation procedures be put in motion by March 1988, with practice drills no less than twice yearly.
