The regularly scheduled monthly meeting of the Staff Congress in May was called to order May 14 at 1:05 p.m. in the University Center, room 108., the June meeting at 12:00 noon was held in the University Ballroom.

## SUNOPSIS OF STAFF CONGRESS MEETING:

### PRESIDENTS REPORT:

This is a combined report for the months of May and June, 1992.

- 1) At the May meeting Jim Alford of the NKU Foundation and Peter Hollister, Vice-President of University Relations came at our request to explain the function of the NKU Foundation fundraising and disbursements. It was both interesting and enlightening.
- 2) At the June Luncheon meeting, we saw one of the examples of the works of that foundation with the awarding of two scholarships to family members of staff employees; Dr. Albright awarded the first to the winner of the A.D. Albright Scholarship, Maria Lynn Baioni. The second award was made to the winner of the Staff Congress Scholarship, Rocke Saccone III, by the Staff Congress president.

Dr. Susan Kemper and her committee, Sandy Cunningham, Penny Parsons, Shirley Raleigh and student, Nicki Ripberger, were commended for a fine job well done. There were eleven applications for scholarship this year making it a very tough job. We thank them and urge those who were not successful this time to apply again next spring.

Mr. John Brooking, president of the Foundation and former member of the Board of Regents was an honored guest at the luncheon. Mr. Brooking was associated with the NKU Board of Regents in one capacity or another since its very beginning.

It was wonderful to see Dr. and Mrs. Albright who drove up from Lexington for the awards luncheon. As you may or may not know, Dr. Albright had much to do with the creation of Staff Congress. It will be eleven years ago this December that our first meeting was held.

While not fully endorsed by Staff Congress the May meeting, of the Board of Regents accepted the new Temporary Disability Policy following a reading by Dr. Boothe of our reasons for concern. Although it has been passed, Dr. Boothe assured us in a follow-up letter that those issues which trouble us will be reviewed and he feels we can come to some agreement about them. But, remember, there are some good benefits for us in the new policy as well as those troublesome ones!

Before I close, please allow me to thank you for the privilege of serving as your president. We didn't accomplish as much as I would have liked but I intend to continue to pursue our goal of having a seat for Congress on the Board of Regents...hopefully, in all Kentucky universities.

Since I will have retired by the next legislative session, I will have more time to lobby for this. I will appreciate your support by you talking to your legislators - and by you writing to your relatives in other parts of the state to encourage them to do the same. While we cannot afford a lobbyist, we can build our own grass roots campaign. Sometimes, that works even better.

Again, thank you for your support and encouragement this past year.

Members, past and present: Think about how you want to handle the Staff Congress Pins. It seems exmembers should turn them in to Peg Goodrich but that is a decision for the new congress to make. Maybe in the future, some provision can be made to have some pins designed for outgoing members and officers.
